Two Pittsburgh Viper Stars Named to Post Gazette Stellar Six

In addition to Oldaker, junior defenseman Alex Baskakov, (6',1", 180 lbs.), Canon-McMillian, was named to the Pittsburgh Post Gazette's "2010-11 Hockey South Stellar Six."
